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Introduction of Our Centre

Putonghua, spoken by over one million native speakers in the world, is the standard and official language of Mainland China. This language is now becoming more and more important, to a point at which many schools in the non-Chinese speaking countries have made Putonghua a compulsory subject for their students to study. Putonghua, with its increasing importance, studying the language seemed to be one of the many life journeys that one should embark on.

The Hong Kong Putonghua Education and Assessment Centre (HKPEAC) was set up by the Faculty of Education, University of Hong Kong in April 1996 to promote Putonghua education in Hong Kong. In the same year, HKPEAC collaborated with the State Language Commission of China to organize the first National Putonghua Proficiency Test in Hong Kong.

In addition to the National Putonghua Proficiency Test, since 1998, HKPEAC has also been organizing the Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK) on a regular basis. The Intensive Putonghua Courses for Foreigners are in connection with the HSK Test, in which each level of the course is in correspondence with the different levels of the HSK Test. Even if you are not planning to take the HSK Test and simply just want to learn another language, HKPEAC also welcomes you!

To promote Putonghua, HKPEAC has been offering a wide range of Putonghua courses for civil servants, teachers and the public. HKPEAC is now working on the development of more creative and practical Putonghua courses hoping to meet the varied needs of the members of the public.

Introduction of Our Course

This program is customized to adult learners who wish to study Mandarin Chinese in an efficient way. The program begins with developing learners' communicative competence in listening and speaking so that learners can speak Mandarin Chinese confidently and properly. On the basis of a good command of communicative skills, learners will study simplified Chinese characters writing skills through various interesting activities informed by the most up-to-date research findings. In addition to language skills, learners will also learn about Chinese culture and current events and will be encouraged to fully participate in Mandarin Chinese speaking context in the University of Hong Kong. This program includes nine modules and each module takes about ten weeks to complete.

Teaching staff

Our instructors all are native Mandarin Chinese speakers. They graduated from recognized institutions at Masters and doctoral level with proven knowledge and rich teaching experience in teaching Mandarin Chinese as a foreign language. In particular, all of our instructors have at least one degree in English and other foreign languages from university and are capable of using the language as a medium of instruction for teaching the Mandarin Chinese in a comparative way with learners' mother languages. They have all achieved the highest band in the Putonghua Proficiency Test (PSC), the national (PRC) proficiency test of standard Mandarin. Our instructors have extensive experience in bilingual and trilingual language instruction in Hong Kong, Beijing, Shanghai, Guangzhou, U.S. UK and European countries, through which they have established a communicative language teaching pedagogy. They are researchers in foreign language education who understand the difficulties and challenges for English and European language speakers while learning the Mandarin Chinese. They apply the recent research findings into our classroom teaching and we constantly refine our teaching methodology based on actual experience to provide optimal results for our learners. This Centre is known for its dynamics of interaction between research and teaching. Unlike local communities in Hong Kong, the Centre creates a Mandarin Chinese speaking community where learners are encouraged to communicate in Mandarin Chinese. We are committed to providing the most effective and the most enjoyable Mandarin Chinese learning experience.

Teaching methodology

Our teaching pedagogy is designed to cater for different levels of students.

For elementary level, the teaching will mainly focus on cultivating learners' listening and oral skills so that they could communicate in Mandarin in their daily lives. The teacher will try to create a lot of opportunities inside classroom for learners to practice. Chinese characters, which have been assumed to be the most difficult part to learn, will also be taught in an interactive and comprehensive way. Our instructors will introduce the origins of Chinese characters as well as the structure. Furthermore, our instructors will introduce composition rules so that students will understand how the character formed into words. Those strategies will more effectively facilitate memorizing than rote learning.

For higher-level students, communicative language teaching pedagogy, which is featured by interaction and communication, will be employed. Our lessons are topic-based. The topics are associated across different levels with varying depth and range so that students can systematically build up their skills and knowledge. We also believe that language is best learnt by using it to solve problems. Our instructors have designed various tasks that integrate training of four language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students will be required to complete the tasks by using those four language skills.

There are two levels in Elementary Putonghua Course, starting from no prior knowledge of the subject to gradually build up vocabularies and the knowledge of pronunciation, to speak short sentences and write Putonghua words. This course trains the students' listening and oral skills so that they can communicate in Mandarin in their daily lives. Teacher may recommend eligible students to take the Chinese Proficiency Test (HSK) after the completion of the course.
